

The celebrated Williams-Hill Bulldogs ran their winning streak to 10 as they ran down the field scoring twenty-two points in the final quarter and a 56-13 final score in a non-conference football game.

The Bulldogs operating behind high stepping Jimmy Jerome rolled at will for four quarters leaving the lowly Panthers dazed. Jerome, one of the top high school backs in the nation, pushed his touchdown total for the year to 33. The flashy Jerome scores three touchdowns and passed for another tussling to Jay Herring for 18 yards and a Bulldog TD. He also scored on runs of one, 18, and returned a punt 65 yards for another. The sensational Jerome has almost 1000 yards in total offense for the season.

James Kenan High fell in a real cliffhanger last Friday night at Tiger Field 27-24 to South Lenoir in an important East Central 2-A game.

James Kenan moved out front 6-0 in the opening minutes as All East Larry Sanderson dashed 31-yards to climax a 58-

yard drive. Moments later the powerful Rabs of Tom Salter took a 7-6 lead as quarterback Frankie Vause hit end Frank Grubbs on a 21 yard TD. Vause added the pat. On the next exchange on punts Vause tossed

a 45 yard bomb to Grubbs and a 12-0 lead. The Bulldogs recovered a fumbled punt and two plays later Sanderson bulled into the dirt and a 12-13 score. Just five seconds before the half Steve Bradford hit the "Doc" Don Best on a 64-yard TD and a 12-13 half time lead.

Early in the final quarter South Lenoir moved 59 yards to take the lead 21-13 behind fullback Sheldon Rhodes three yard run. Vause added the two points. James Kenan came right back to go out front 24-21 moving 66 yards with Sanderson plunging two yards for the TD. With just under one minute left in the game South Lenoir struck for the final blow, behind some of the poorest officiating ever seen at Tiger Field.

Boys that work all week on the practice field should have the best leadership by officials come game time. The conference should look into this matter and come up with something better than just strip shirts and poor knowledge of the game.
