1972 REAP Accomplishments

1,027 Duplin County farmers matched funds with the Federal Government to install needed conservation and pollution-control measures last year. Measures, which included practices to protect and conserve soil, retain and control water runoff, retard or eliminate pollution conditions, and enhance wildlife, were carried out through the 1972 Rural Environmental Assistance Program (REAP). Cost-share and technical assistance furnished to county farmers in 1972 amounted to \$86,044. This represents an estimated total conservation investment in the county of about \$172,176 when the farmer's share of the cost and labor is considered.

Practices completed in 1972 included 307 acres of permanent pasture, 736 acres drained by tile and open ditch, 13,366 acres of vegetative cover, and 304 acres of forestry.

Statewide, 63,354 farmers carried out needed conservation and environmental improvement practices, valued at an estimated \$17 million in connection with the 1972 REAP. Cost-sharing and technical assistance amoun-

ted to about \$1.1 million. This helps assure that our present and future natural resources such as soil, water, forests, air, and beauty will be available for the generations to come.


