

narrative tries to not only tell of the disaster that befell Russian arms in the first few weeks of World War I, but why it happened and also of that disaster's fearful implications for Russia's future.

The author begins his narrative by depicting rural life in Rostov-on-Don, the author's own native town. Fictional and historical characters are interwoven throughout the work. After a leisurely introductory note on family life in Russia just before the great catastrophe, the author charges scene and pace. He moves into an account of the campaign that culminated in the Battle of Tamenberg. It is the story chiefly of General Alexander Samsonov's Second Army, which was sent into battle with no real orders from above, without adequate reconnaissance patrols or anything resembling an efficient communications system, green troops plodding back and forth across the sandy plains with virtually no food and water, under the aimless direction of commanders as intent on plotting against one another as on engaging the enemy. The wonder was, of course, that they won such initial successes as they briefly enjoyed, possibly because the overwhelmingly efficient and well trained German soldiers and officers held back in disbelief, mistaking the Russian command's stupidity for an artful plan.

Interspersed with the nightmare of the battle are scenes of Russian life: the anarchistic government of the Tsarist rule and the general cultural decay of the entire Tsarist society.

Two books which rank among the best sellers today are HARRY S. TRUMAN, written by his daughter, Margaret Truman, and AUGUST 1914 by the Nobel Prize winning Author, Alexander Solzhenitsyn. Both books have received varied response from major critics. The informed person should read these books for himself and come to his own conclusion. Both books are available at either the Dorothy-Wightman or the Thelma D. Bryant Libraries.

It is no surprise that HARRY S. TRUMAN the reader gets daughterly zeal and praise of a beloved father: Margaret Truman portrays a father who was seldom if ever wrong. But she also presents a very readable account of one of the most truly exciting careers. Miss Truman opens with a chapter in which she tells the famous story of the 1948 Presidential Campaign, in which her father with dogged determination ran against and defeated Governor Thomas E. Dewey of New York. Then the author narrates the Truman family history; she often reveals some interesting intimate details. Diary excerpts and her father's letters to members of the family fill the book with zest, humor and, "an off-stage Truman manner". No issues are dodged; even the Truman Administration's decision to use the first atomic bomb against Japan is squarely faced and discussed. Miss Truman restricts herself to scrupulous examination of historical detail. And yet, the book is not merely a historical survey. For Margaret Truman has also woven the homely details of her parents' family life and her own career into the book.

Margaret Truman auditioned for one of the best voice teachers in America and she spent many long hours each day practicing. In spite of much opposition from family, relatives, friends and even Presidential advisors, Margaret made her first appearance on the concert stage in 1947 with Eugene Ormandy and the Hollywood Bowl Symphony. In 1948 she gave up singing to help her father on the Campaign trail.
