PHIL 210 Common Elements of Knowledge-June 12-August 2; Tues. and Thurs. 7-10 p.m.

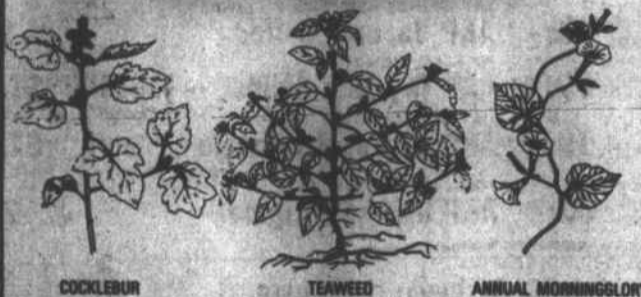
ENG 330 Children's Literature-June 11-August 1-Mon. and Wed. Time to be arranged according to wishes of majority of class.
