The cadet is a 1971 graduate of James Kenan High School.

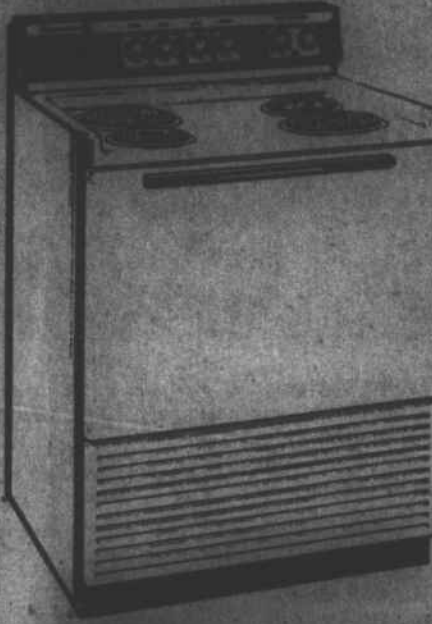
Mrs. Rouse Speaks Before Committee

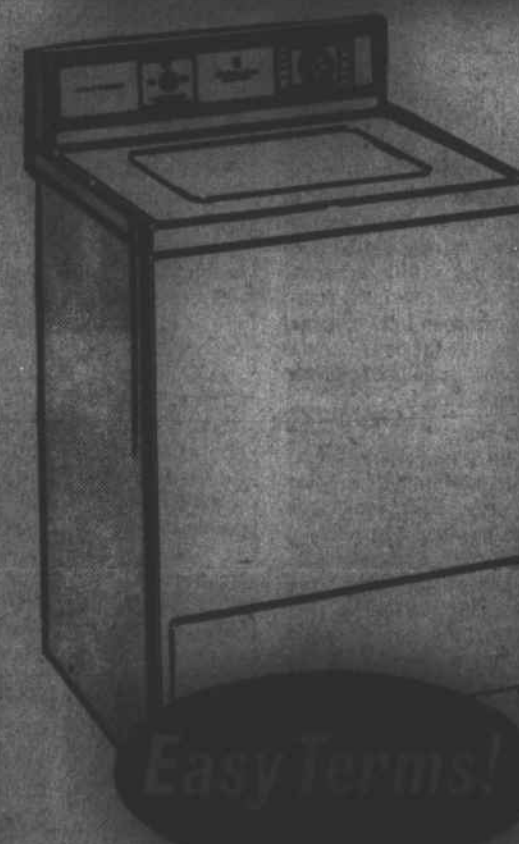

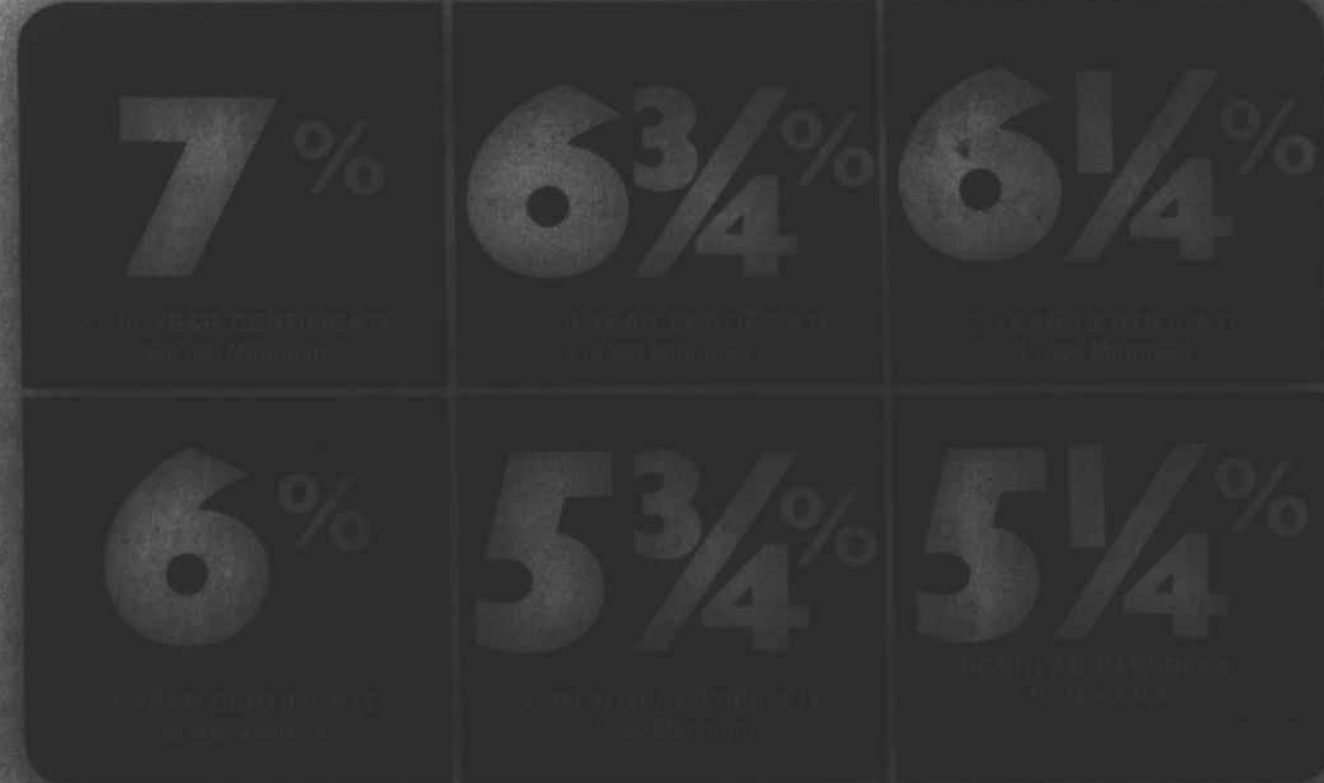
