Man Found Shot to Death on Highway in Duplin

A Rt. 2, Rose Hill man was found shot to death late Saturday night on highway at Tin City in southern Duplin County.
 Deputy Glenn Jernigan, investigator with the Duplin County Sheriff's Department, said the body of Henry Vernon Carr, black male about 45, was found in the short stretch of road that was part of N. C. 41 before the highway was

widened.
 Carr had been shot three times and was dead when officers arrived, Jernigan said. The sheriff's department was alerted after someone telephone the Wallace Police Department to report the slaying.
 Jernigan said no arrests had been made, but investigation was continuing.
