## Beulaville Changes Election Rules

The Beulaville Town Board of Commissioners held a public meeting recently in regards to changes in election rules and amend to the town's charter.

The motion was carried to read:  
 1. The Mayor and two commissioners who receive the most votes in the election be elected for four years.  
 2. The remaining three commissioners be elected for two year terms and at the expiration of the two year terms, the successors in office in the above three commissioners be elected for four year terms.  
 Following the regular board meeting, Mayor Pate explained the new rulings on election changes, and held a discussion on them before the motion to adopt them was accepted unanimously.  
 The commissioners all con-

currred in connection with the hiring of John Gardner for the town Laborer Job.  
 Billy Doenic was appointed to the Beulaville zoning board by a motion which was carried by agreement of the board members.  
 A motion was placed on the floor to raise the water rates as of September 1. This was passed by all members of the commissioners.  
 Discussion on a suggested street light was tabled until the next meeting, with no further business the board adjourned.
