Mrs. Louise Wells, President, presided. The meeting was opened with the Ritual and prayer led by the Chaplain, Mrs. Robert West. This was followed by one verse of "Amazing Grace" sung in unison. The pledge to the U. S. flag and the salutes to the N. C. and Confederate flags were led by Mrs. N. B. Boney. As retiring treasurer Mrs. Boney also gave her report for the year. Mrs. Wells appointed Mrs. J. W. Farrisler and Mrs. Pearl McGowan to select appropriate gifts for Mrs. Boney and Mrs. J. W. Boney, who have been members of the James Kanan Chapter for fifty years. These coins now sell for \$15.00 except to members of the UDC who may purchase them for \$8.75. Still another laudable project of the organization mentioned by Mrs. Stevens, is the Educational program, which, she said is really big business. The General Organization has 15 different scholarship funds amounting to \$281,000. The total investments

are \$889,943. In 1973 a total of 359 scholarships were given to worthy descendants of Confederate veterans. Last year students from 20 states attended 44 different colleges and universities on UDC Scholarships. North Carolina Division has over \$150,000 invested in 23 scholarships.
