Kenny Brown, Smith's bruising fullback, ran the second play of the game for a 69 touchdown run, off tackle. He also scored later on a long pass play that covered 20 yards. Robert Miller, star halfback, ran a T.D. of nearly 70 yards later on for the last Smith score.

Smith had 220 yards rushing for the day while Warsaw had 80.
