Traits Of An Alcoholic

Which of the following statements about alcoholics are true? 1) Alcoholics can't say no after a few drinks; 2) Alcoholics' drinking habits aren't affected by cost; 3) Alcoholics choose to drink alone. Believe it or not, but each is false. New findings indicate that even supposedly incorrigible alcoholics are capable of almost Aristotelian moderation, if circumstances are controlled. According to Dr. George Bigelow of the University of Minnesota, most alcoholics when given a choice of five



drinks per day and hospital privileges as against 24 drinks daily and no privileges, chose the five-drink unit. Other tests revealed to Dr. Bigelow that cost restricts a drinker's zeal for indulgence, while social gatherings encouraged freer drinking habits among alcoholics.
