About his service with our department and to the state, Parker said, "I was transferred to the Duplin County Unit with the understanding that the adult population would be placed with youthful offenders. This was done in April 1970. We set up a pilot program of the entire unit being involved in vocational and academic training. Our goals were and still are to train the student in some type of vocation and find him employment in this field. We also hope that by operating an open unit with a relaxed set of rules that we could restore confidence and self-respect that so many inmates lose. We also wanted to make the community aware of what we were doing and why, and to obtain all the help that they could grant us.

"We have fulfilled part of our goals. We are training the students in a trade and getting employment in their field for some of them. However, the percentage is not high enough to make us complacent, and with the help of our staff and other agencies, we are going to improve in this area. We definitely feel that the open prison and relaxed atmosphere have been an asset to our training program and has accomplished what we hoped it would when we started this program.

"We have met with and spoken to many civic and church groups in the community. We have explained our program and had excellent response from the community when we asked their help. We still need more community support and help in establishing new programs and this is something we are planning to work on in the near future.

"Overall, I feel the project started in April, 1970 has been a success and an asset to our department in the direction we are now taking in the rehabilitation of inmates."

The Department of Social Rehabilitation and Control feels that the service Superintendent Parker has given to the state and his community has been a value to both.
