N. Duplin Loses Appeal

The first round of North Duplin's eligibility fight is over and the school lost. The executive committee of the North Carolina High School Athletic Association last week rejected an appeal of the ruling which requires North Duplin to forfeit six games including three Carolina Conference battles of an ineligible player. The Rebels' record now officially is 3-3 in league play and 3-6 over-all. North Duplin officials indicated over the past two weeks that further action, in an effort to over-turn the ruling, may be undertaken before the end of the current football season.

Wreck Kills Two At Suttontown

Two Faison area residents were killed Friday morning shortly after 7 o'clock in a grinding head-on collision of a car and a pickup on highway NC 50, about eight miles west of Faison in the Suttontown community.

Mrs. Mamie Tadlock Sutton, 74, of route 1, Faison, driver of a 1976 Chrysler and John Thomas Howell, 52, of route 2, Faison, a passenger in the 1968 Ford truck, were killed instantly in the crash.

The driver of the truck, Harold Glenn Mobley of Rose Hill, suffered visible injuries and was given first-aid by Faison Rescue Squad members and taken to Sampson Memorial hospital at Clinton.

State Trooper D. L. Pridden, who investigated the accident, said the truck was traveling west on NC 50 and the Sutton car was going east. Trooper Pridden said the Sutton vehicle turned left into the path of the truck and the two vehicles collided head on. The trooper said the Sutton woman was apparently attempting to turn left onto rural paved road 1100.

The accident occurred in Sampson county. Both vehicles were declared total losses.

Funeral services for Mrs. Sutton were held Saturday at 3 p.m. from Crumpler-Honeycutt Funeral home in Clinton, with the Rev. Sam Moore as the officiating minister. Burial followed in the Sutton family cemetery at Suttontown.

Survivors include four daughters, Mrs. Marie Justice and Mrs. Ethel Mae Grantham, both of Goldsboro, Mrs. Martha Daughtry of Faison, and Mrs. Edna King of Mount Olive; two sons, George Sutton of Faison

and Gene Sutton of Smithfield; four sisters, Mrs. Oscar Sutton of Faison, Mrs. Raymond Williamson of Norfolk, Va., Mrs. C. S. King and Mrs. Emma Mansburn, both of Clinton; 16 grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

Funeral services for Howell were held Wednesday at 3 p.m. from Hills Chapel Baptist church near Faison, with the Rev. J. M. Grimes officiating. Burial will follow in the Hill Family cemetery in Faison.
