## Mount Olive First Baptist Plans Dedication

The First Baptist Church will dedicate its newly renovated Sanctuary Sunday, Nov. 11.

Presentation of the Building to the architect will be given by Ben Daniels, General Contractor, Presentation of the Building to the Building Committee given by Conrad Wessell, Architect, Presentation of the Building to the Trustees given by Russell Kelly, Chairman, Building Renovation Committee, and Acceptance of the Building given by Mack Her-ring, Trustee.

The dedicatory address will be delivered by A.Z. Gorgans, Minister of the church.

Special activities for the day begin with Sunday School, Service of Dedication, and Dinner on the grounds. The building will remain open during the afternoon. A concert will be presented at 7:30 p.m. on the church's new Southern-Holbrook's 21 rank pipe organ by Dr. H. Max Smith, professor of Music. Following the concert there will be a reception in the Church Fellowship Hall honoring Dr. Smith.

Total cost of the building, including furnishings, was approximately \$380,000.

Two unique attributes of the Baptistery area include a large wooden cross, and the doors covering the Baptistery area feature eight of the earliest Christian symbols.

The outer structure also received complete renovation through a thorough Sandblasting treatment.

The First Baptist Church was founded in 1870. Present membership is 850. Receipts for all causes in 1972 totaled \$104,000.

All former pastors of the church have been invited to attend the dedication activities as special guests, as well as many former members and friends of the church.
