

TAKE THE TOY TEST

Right or Wrong? A child is safe with any plaything since it's only a toy.

Wrong: U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission injury figures are projections of data collected from 119 National Electronic Injury Surveillance System (NEISS) hospitals which indicate that in fiscal year 1973 nearly 515,000 injuries associated with toys, tricycles and bicycles were treated in hospital emergency rooms. NEISS data do not include injuries treated at home, in doctors' offices, health centers, school health facilities, or after direct hospital admission.

The U.S. CPSC, an independent Federal agency created by Congress to reduce the number of injuries to consumers from consumer products, has banned 1,500 hazardous toys. Manufacturers are prohibited from making a banned toy unless they correct the hazardous detail. Retailers, too, are forbidden to sell a banned toy under penalty of law. Concerned adults can help the Commission protect children by purchasing toys that fit the child's age and abilities and by informing the Commission of toys they believe are hazardous. Also remember that a youngster may get his hands on complex toys bought for older brothers and sisters.

Even a carefully chosen toy, however, may be dangerous. Adults should keep an eye on a child at play. Teach children proper use of toys. Finally, be on the alert for broken or rusted toys that could become dangerous.
