In front of this was a wicker basket of palms, a white satin kneeling bench, and at either side, two wicker baskets of palms.

The bride, escorted to the altar by her father, and given in marriage by her parents, was attired in a white floor-length thin cotton flounce gown, with ruffled flounce at the bottom of the gown, the waist at an empire style, and elbow bell sleeves.
