NOTICE TO PERSONS UNABLE TO PAY THEIR DUBLIN GENERAL HOSPITAL

Kenansville, North Carolina

The North Carolina Department of Human Resources, Division of Facility Services, has established the sum of \$50,000 as the level of uncompensated services to be made available by the Duplin General Hospital, Kenansville, North Carolina in the period October 1, 1975 to September 30, 1979. This determination has been made pursuant to the regulations of the regulations of the Public Health Service, U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare, 42 CFR 53.111 (Public Health Act) and the applicable provisions of North Carolina Medical Facilities Construction Act.

"Uncompensated services" means services available in the facility which are made available to persons unable to pay therefor without charge or at a charge which is less than the reasonable cost of such services. The level of such services is measured by the difference between the amount paid by such persons for the services and the reasonable cost thereof.

The level set out above meets the presumptive compliance guidelines of the Federal regulations and is 3 percent of operating costs under the Hospital and Medical Facilities Construction Act.

Copies of the criteria used for identifying persons unable to pay for services may be obtained from North Carolina Department of Human Resources, Division of Facility Services, 1330 St. Mary's Street, Raleigh, N.C. between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. on regular business days.
