The North Carolina law and the Duplin County Board of Education have established certain entry requirements, it is necessary to comply withthe requirements listed below:

Immunization: Diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough vaccine; Polio vaccine; and Measies - red, rubella A birth certificate or other satisfactory evidence of date of birth is required. To meet age requirement, the child must be five years old on or before October 15, 1979.

Bring birth certificate.

Forms for physical examination should be completed and taken to the schools on or before the opening day of school, 1979.
