sanctuary for a period of meditation, and then come to the altar where the pastor will be waiting and ready to serve you.

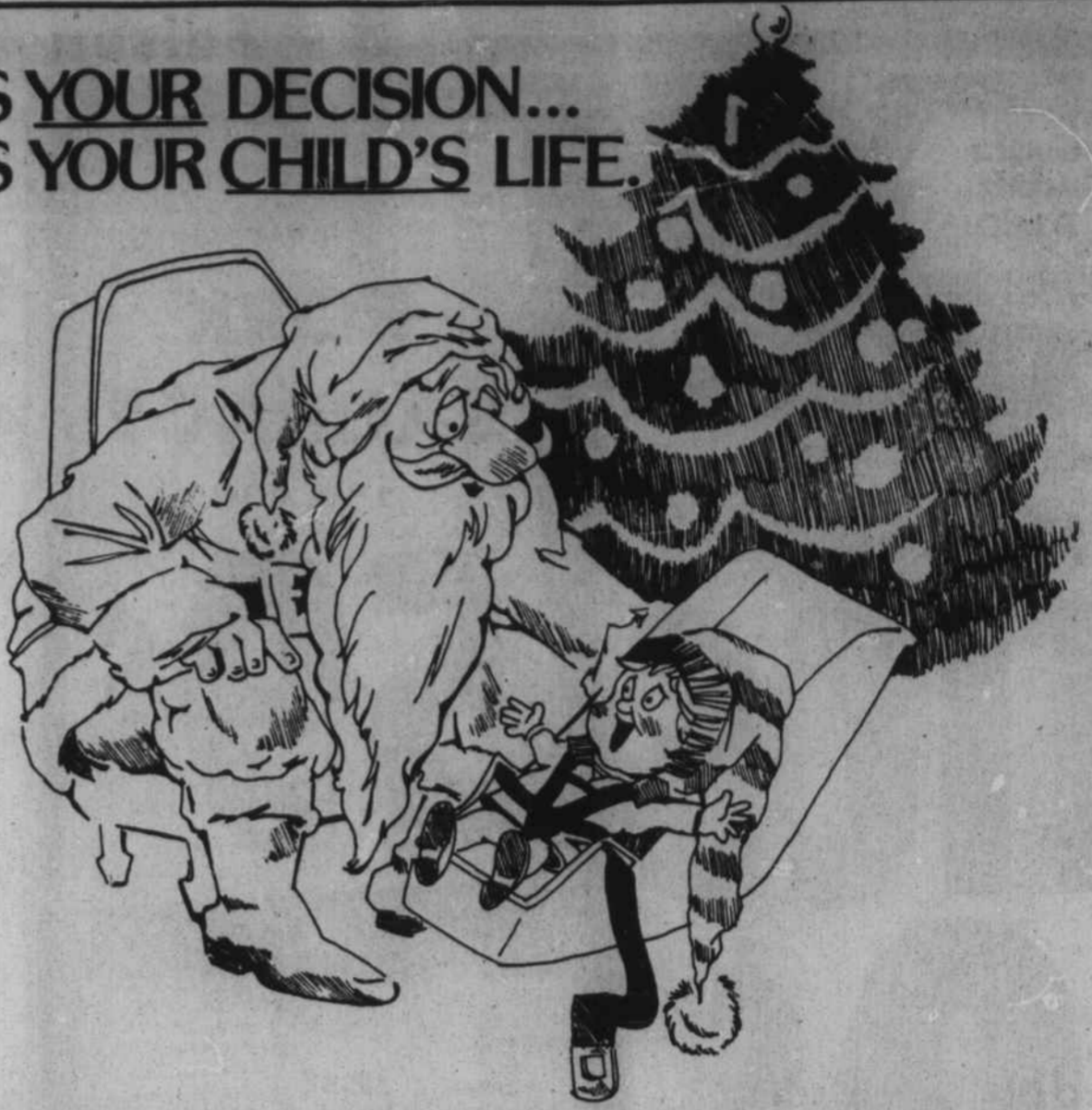

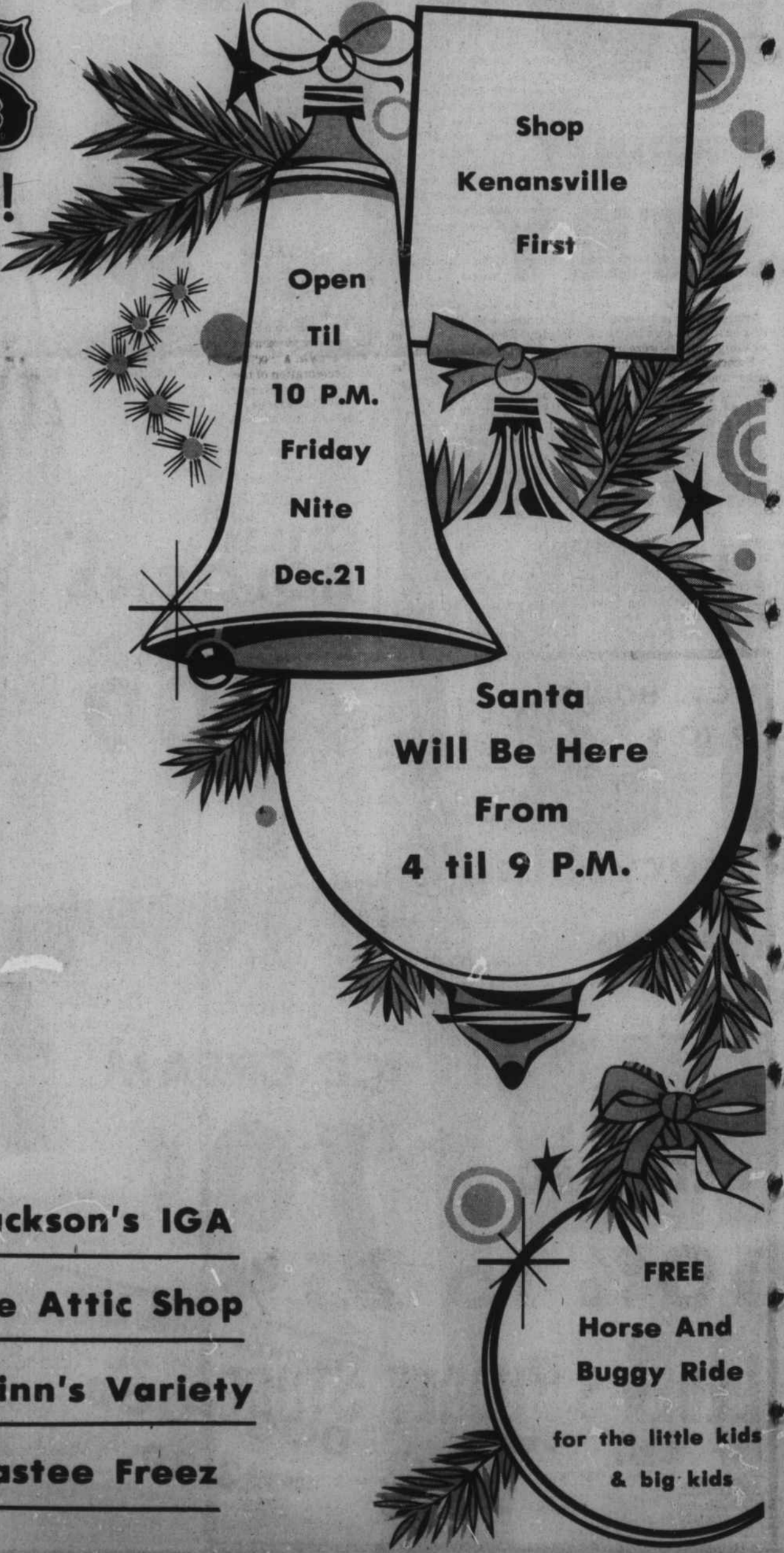
