SUMMER FELLOWSHIP RECIPIENT

Ms. Karen Dawes, instructor of Sociology, has been awarded a Summer Fellowship by the National Endowment for the Humanities. Ms. Dawes will be attending a Seminar led by Dr. John Reed, Professor of Sociology, UNC-Chapel Hill, from June 23 through August 15, 1980. The Seminar is entitled "Continuity and Change in Southern Culture" and focuses on "popular and literary images and stereotypes of the South and Southerners which contribute to persisting regional self-consciousness." Only 12 seminar participants were selected from teachers of the Humanities and Social Sciences in institutions of higher education in a nationwide competition.

ROBERTS TO ATTEND HARVARD ON POST-DOCTORAL GRANT

Dr. Adrian Ray Roberts, Jr., formerly of Warsaw, will attend Harvard University during the July summer term of 1980. During that term

he will be pursuing a post-doctoral study consisting of participation in an educational institute as well as conducting research in the area of educational feedback technology. His study will be funded, in part, from grants through the Southern Consortium of Colleges of Teacher Education and North Carolina Central University. Roberts is presently an associate professor of education at North Carolina Central University and an adjunct (part-time) professor with East Carolina University. He is formerly a principal and teacher with the Duplin County Schools and a federal programs director with the Tarboro City Schools.

Roberts received his B.S., Magna Cum Laude, in 1968 and his M.A. degree in 1970 from East Carolina University. He received the doctoral degree in 1976 from Duke University. His dissertation study was entitled "A Study of the Use of An Electronic Feedback System in the Decision-Making Process of Selected North Carolina School Districts."

While at North Carolina Central University, Roberts has been a member and president of his local chapter of the NCAE (North Carolina Association of Educators), a member of Phi Delta Kappa (honorary society in education), and a representative of the education department on the North Carolina Central University Faculty Senate. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Adrian Ray Roberts, Sr., of Warsaw.
