



Barwick-Williams Vows Spoken

In a candlelight ceremony on Sunday, April 25, at three o'clock in the afternoon, Margaret Clara Williams and Wyatt Hardy Barwick solemnized their wedding vows before the Rev. Jean Hood at the Pink Hill United Methodist Church.

The couple spoke their vows before an altar decorated with spiral candelabrum and complimented with baskets of spring flowers containing snapdragons, mums, fuzi pompons, carnations and gypsophila.
