## Liberty Run To Kick Off Festival

The Liberty Run, which will kick off the 1981 Liberty Festival, may well be the biggest road race yet for this area. The beautiful ten kilometer course which starts on East Broadway and ends at the same point has been measured and certified by the North Carolina Association of the Athletics Congress of the U.S.A. and

In addition to the ten-kilometer race, there will be a one-mile "fun run" starting out on the course and finishing on East Broadway Street in Pink Hill. The

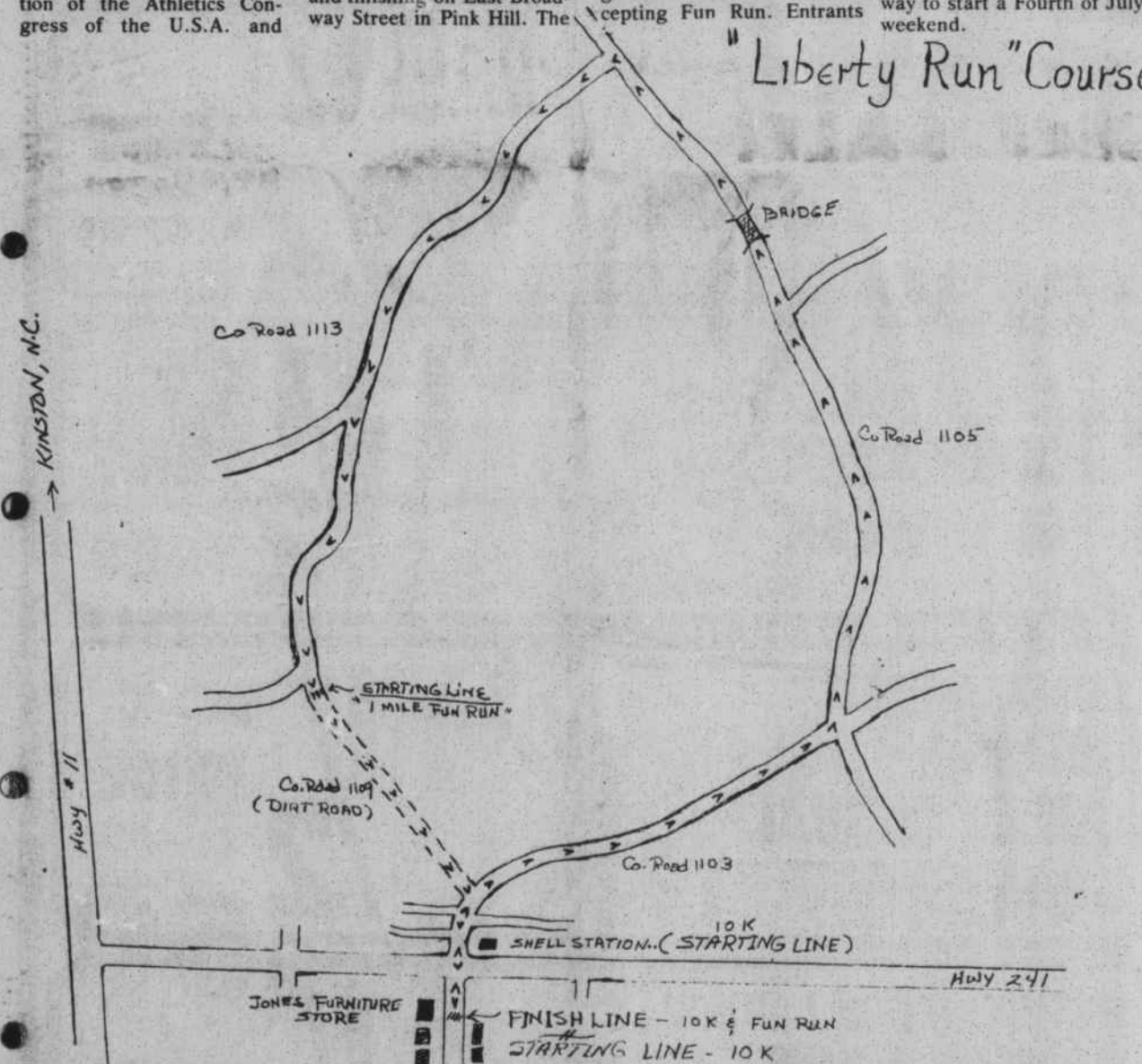
