Attend State FFA Convention

Patrol Station

Funds Approved

The General Assembly this week appropriated \$100,000 for a State Highway Patrol station in Kenansville.

The appropriation was included among \$6 million in "pork-barrel" appropriation bills approved in the final sessions of the legislature Monday and Tuesday.

Rep. Douglas A. Clark, D-Duplin, said the sum "is about half what we need for the station."

The station will be located on a 5-acre tract the state owns along N.C. 11 south of Elizabethtown. Clark said the land was part of the state correctional unit's property, but was not needed by the unit and was transferred to

the Department of Crime Control and Public Safety about two years ago for this purpose.

The station here serves Duplin and Pender counties. It is now located in a former school south of Kenansville off N.C. 24.

Clark said Duplin County legislators have been trying to get money for the station since 1973. "The legislature killed the bill in 1980," Clark said, "because we had no location at that time."

The appropriation will permit site preparation and design. Completion of the project will depend on funding from the 1983 legislature.

Duplin Historical Society Meets

The Duplin County Historical Society held its quarterly meeting, June 26, 1982, at the Rose Hill Restaurant, Rose Hill, N.C. Guest speaker for the meeting was Dr. John D. Neville, Executive Secretary of America's Four Hundredth Anniversary Committee.

Dr. Neville presented a most interesting talk on the plans and projects in the making for America's Four Hundredth Anniversary Celebration. This is a celebration commemorating the establishment of the first colony in the Americas by Sir Walter Raleigh in July of 1584 on Roanoke Island.

One of the projects that is sure to generate much interest, is the construction of a

16th century sailing ship, built as closely as possible to the same design as the one that brought the first colonist to the Outer Banks on July 13, 1584. The ship will have a permanent berth at Roanoke Island for tours, but will travel to other ports on the North Carolina coast and be open for tours during the Anniversary celebration.

Many other plans are in the making, and the Four Hundredth Anniversary celebration will begin in April, 1984 in England, and in July, 1984 in North Carolina. Mrs. Ann Craft, Kenansville, is the Chariman for Duplin County of America's Four Hundredth Anniversary Committee.
