Stephens report on youth activities was given by Mrs. W.M. Ingram. After the report on the Christmas Cheer Project for the U.S. Naval Hospital at Camp Lejeune by Mrs. Viola W. Some were in Multimedia First Aid, others in CPR and still others in Water Safety and a total of 163 certificates were issued.
