Duplin Kindergarten Registration

The Duplin County public schools urge parents to register all children who will attend kindergarten for the school year 1983-84. North Carolina law and the Duplin County Board of Education have established certain entry requirements. It is necessary to comply with the requirements which are listed: Immunizations: diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough vaccine, polio vaccine, red measles (rubeola) and German measles (rubella), and mumps (recommended but not mandatory). Immunization must be completed prior to enrollment in the fall. Early registration will give time to have all requirements completed. Bring immunization record. A birth certificate or other satisfactory evidence of date

Kindergarten children presently enrolled will not attend school the day of kindergarten registration in their school.

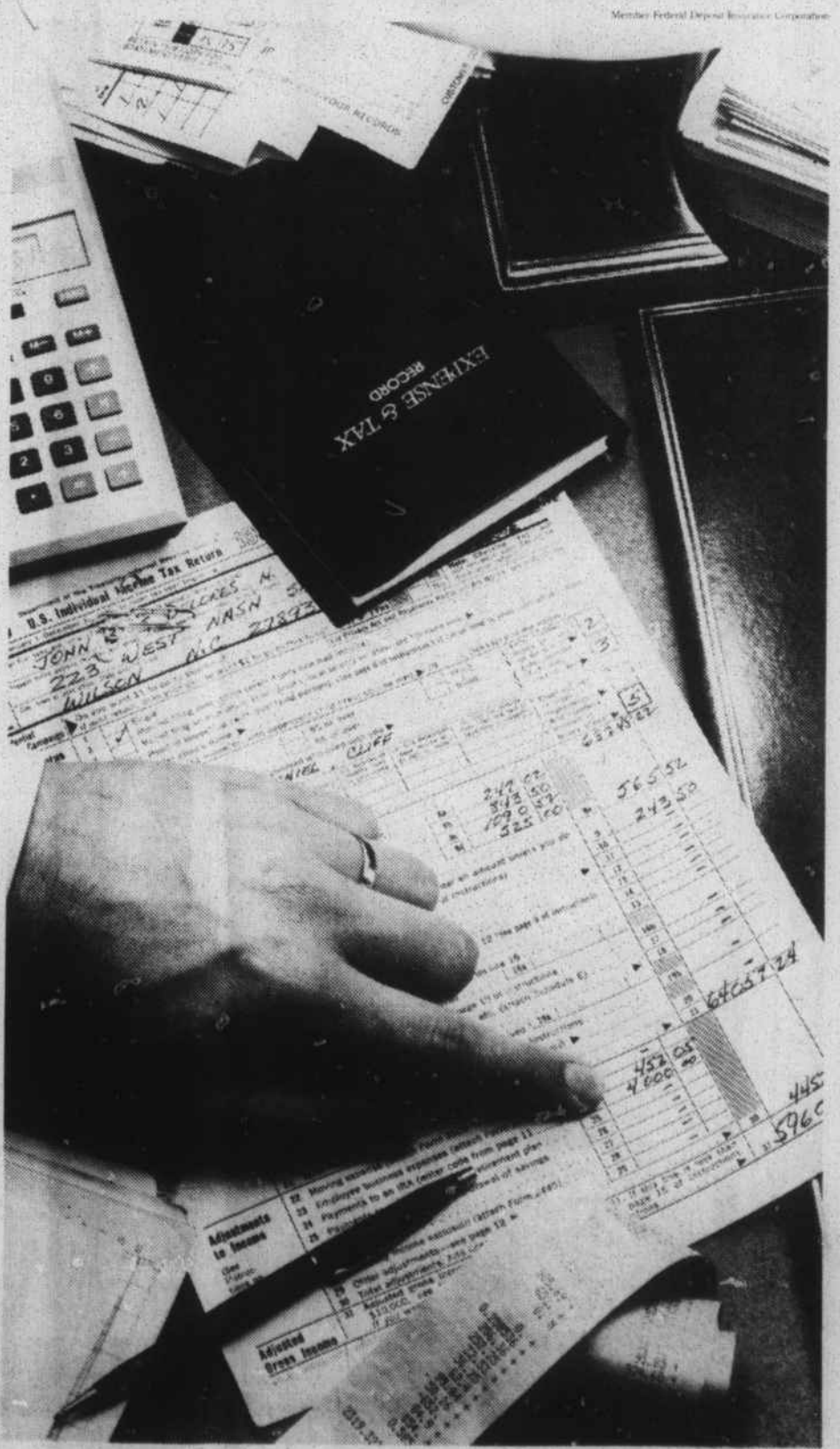
