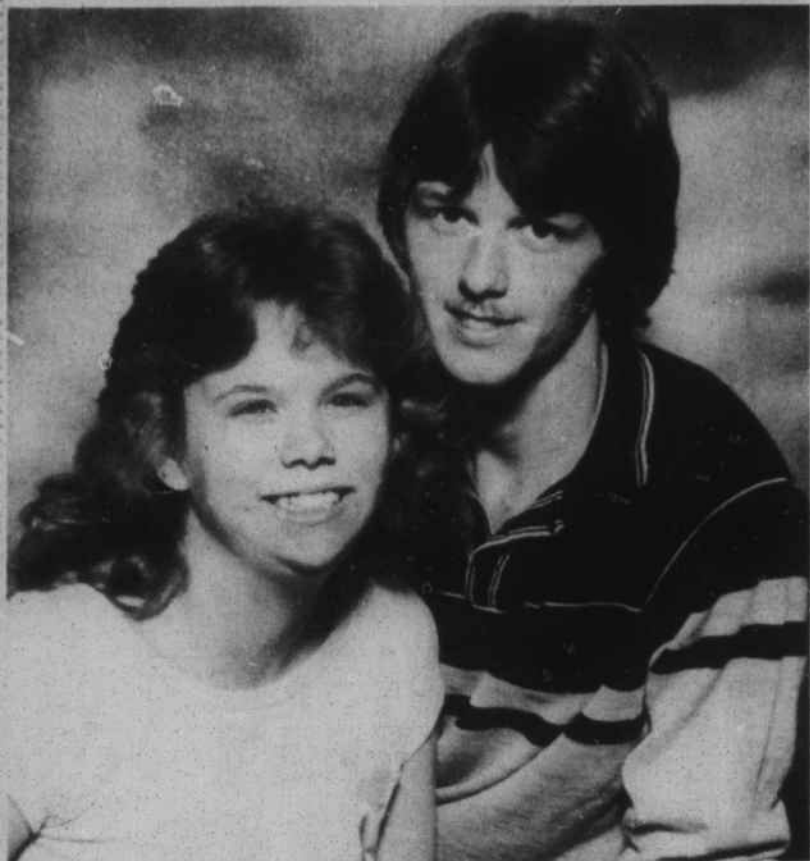




Engagement Announced
