

Parker Named Member Of The Year By State

Lloyd Parker of Kenansville, superintendent of the Duplin County Prison Unit, was named Member of the Year by the State Employees Association of North Carolina at the group's annual convention in Winston-Salem.

Parker was cited by the 47,000-member organization for his activities in the association and in the community. Parker is incoming chairman of District 47 of SEANC. This past year he served as membership co-chairman.

On July 1, the N.C. State Government Employees Association and the N.C. State Employees Association merged into the largest non-union affiliated public employees' association in the nation. In the old NCSGEA, Parker served as state membership chairman, Unit chairman and on the Department of Correction Insurance committee.

Parker shared Member of the Year honors with J.E. Skinner of Ahoskie, an assistant division engineer in the Department of Transportation and immediate past president of the NCSGEA.
