Receives Funds For Emergency Food And Shelter Program

Lenoir County has been selected to receive \$24,838 to supplement emergency food and shelter programs in this area. The county chapter of the American Red Cross will function as the administrative staff and fiscal agent for the program.

The county money is part of the \$70 million appropriated by Congress to the Emergency Food and Shelter program, created to help expand the capacity of food and shelter programs in high-need areas around the country.

A local appointed board will award

grants to various local governmental or private voluntary organizations that meet the guidelines specified by the EFSP.

To qualify, an organization must: be non-profit, have an accounting system and conduct an annual audit, practice non-discrimination, have demonstrated the ability to deliver

emergency food and/or shelter programs, and, if a private organization, they should have a voluntary board.

Qualifying organizations are urged to apply to the local Board. For more information, contact Ms. Connie May, American Red Cross, 523-4528.

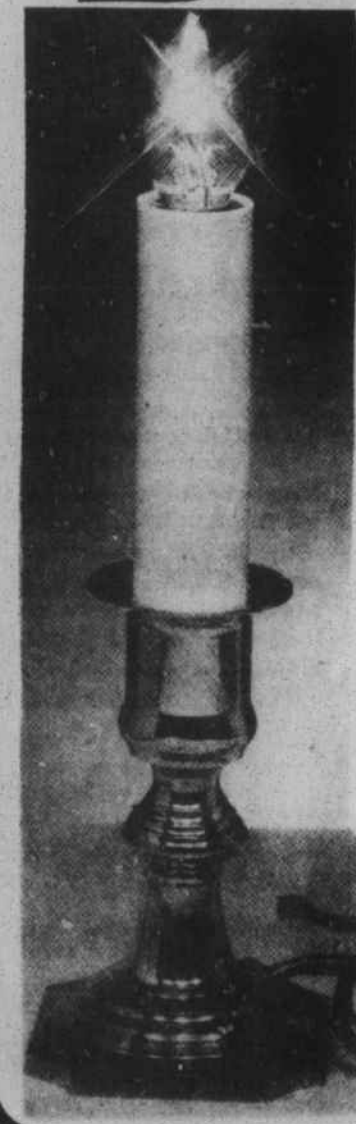
