AMONG THE ISRAELITES, HOSPITALITY TO STRANGERS WAS NOT ONLY A TRADITIONAL ETIQUETTE BUT IT WAS WRITTEN INTO MOSAIC LAW (EX. 22:21 23:9) (DEUT. 10:19). NO DEVOUT PERSON WOULD DELIBERATELY AVOID THE CHANCE TO HELP A STRANGER. IN A LAND THAT WAS EXTREMELY HOT AND WATER SCARCE, JUST A COOLING DRINK WAS VERY IMPORTANT TO THE STRANGER PASSING THROUGH! IT WAS ALSO THE ETIQUETTE OF THOSE TIMES FOR NO MAN TO DRINK FROM A WELL THAT WASN'T HIS--UNTIL HE WAS ASKED, OR OFFERED THE WATER, BY THE WELL'S OWNER. DRAWING WATER FROM THE WELL OF A TOWN WAS THE DUTY OF THE YOUNG MAIDS AND SO IT FELL TO THEM, QUITE OFTEN, TO COME TO THE AID OF A THIRSTY STRANGER. THIS LITTLE ACT OF "COMFORT TO THE TRAVELER" WAS SO INGRAINED IN THE PEOPLE, THAT WHEN JESUS CHARGED HIS DISCIPLES TO PREACH, AND TO HEAL, AND TO DO GOOD TO THE MULTITUDES, HE REFERRED TO IT AS GIVING "A CUP OF WATER IN MY NAME!" (MARK 9:41)
