

JAMES KENAN Baseball

The Varsity Tigers of James Kenan began the 1985 baseball season with two conference wins but suffered losses last week to bring their record to two wins and two losses.

After defeating Union and East Duplin, the Tigers played Midway and Hobbton last week and were defeated. The Tigers are coached by Tom McMahon.

Midway scored late in the game. The teams battled five innings

Kenan 5-2. The Tigers picked up an additional score in the fourth on a run batted in by David Johnson. Hobbton scored again in the fifth and sixth to total nine runs for the game. The Tigers scored again in the seventh when David Hughes led off with a double and later scored along with George Jackson and Cam Pridgen. The game ended at the bottom half of the seventh with Hobbton leading 9 to 6.

Pitching for James Kenan was Mark Ellenberg and Todd Taylor. Ellenberg was recorded with the loss after pitching five innings and facing 17 batters. He allowed three hits, five runs and six walks, and struck out six. Warren, the winning pitcher for Hobbton, completed seven innings, faced 29, allowed seven hits, six runs and one walk. He struck out one batter.

The Tigers faced North Duplin at James Kenan Monday and play Wallace-Rose Hill today at Legion Stadium.

Mount Olive Attorney Begins Sentence

Former North Carolina State Bar president-elect George Kornegay was to begin serving a 30-month prison term last week for embezzling his clients' money.

Kornegay, a Mount Olive attorney, has remained free on bond and continued practicing law since his 1983 conviction, while his appeals were pending. In a federal court hearing in Raleigh last week, he lost his latest bid to delay serving the sentence.

Kornegay was convicted of embezzling \$14,500 from the trust account of a client, obtaining \$21,000 from a 72-year-old widowed client by false pretense and embezzling \$600,000 from funds belonging to law partners.

Truck-Car Crash Kills Warsaw Man

Gene Autry "Red" Smith, 34, of Route 2, Warsaw, was killed late Tuesday in a collision between his car and a tractor-trailer on N.C. 24 in Sampson County west of Warsaw, the state highway patrol headquarters in Clinton reported Wednesday.

The patrol reported that Smith, driving a 1977 Chevrolet, made a "U-turn" in front of an on-coming tractor-trailer rig. Edwin Thompson of Faison, a passenger in the Smith vehicle, was injured and is treated at Clinton Memorial Hospital in Clinton.

Bobby Gray Harrell, 47, of Route 1, Warsaw, driver of the 18-wheeler, escaped injury. Damage to his rig was estimated at \$4,000. He was not charged.
