DUPLIN COUNTY NORTH CAROLINA ORDINANCE AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING A "NO PARKING" ZONE ON EAST SIDE OF MAIN STREET (NORTH CAROLINA HIGHWAY NUMBER 11) WHERE BEASLEY STREET INTERSECTS MAIN STREET AT THE WORTHINGTON BUILDING PROPERTY AND THE HENRY STEVENS PROPERTY IN THE TOWN OF KENANSVILLE

WHEREAS, the Town Board of Commissioners of Kenansville finds that it is necessary in the interest of promoting the free flow of vehicular and pedestrian traffic in and around the one area where Beasley Street intersects Main Street (North Carolina Highway Number 11) at the Worthington Building property and the Henry Stevens property and for the public welfare of the citizens of the Town, to designate a "No Parking" Zone on the East side of Main Street (North Carolina Highway Number 11) in front of the Worthington Building Property for 85 feet as measured from Beasley Street and in front of the Henry Stevens property for 85 feet as measured from Beasley Street in the Town of Kenansville.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Kenansville: SECTION 1. A "No Parking" Zone is hereby designated on the East side of Main Street (North Carolina Highway Number 11) in front of the Worthington Building property for 85 feet and in front of the Henry Stevens property for 85 feet as measured from Beasley Street.

SECTION 2. Any person who violates this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable as prescribed by G.S. 14-4. SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the Town of Kenansville within 10 days from the date of its adoption. SECTION 4. This ordinance shall become effective as soon as the "NO PARKING" Zone has been properly marked and designated. SECTION 5. All other laws, ordinances or regulations heretofore passed by this governing body which are repugnant to this ordinance are hereby repealed. A summary of the Proposed Budget is as follows: General Fund 217,687.00 *General Revenue Sharing Fund 18,660.00 Debt Service Fund 35,980.00 Water and Sewer Fund 108,718.00 Total Budget 381,045.00

The public will please take notice that the General Revenue Sharing part of this budget only figures for two quarterly payments due to the fact that the federal government is proposing that General Revenue Sharing be cut off at the end of September 1985. We plan to conduct our hearing on the assumption that it will be funded for another full year and that we can then make budget amendments to allow for this continuance. The proposed use of General Revenue Sharing Funds is to finish paying for the new Town Hall as agreed when the 1984-85 budget was adopted.

At the hearing, oral and written comments will be received in reference to use of GRS Funds as well as

comments on other budgeted funds.

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Program At North Duplin

A summer enrichment educational program, pre-kindergarten through grade 6, will be offered at the North Duplin Elementary School beginning for students on Thursday, June 20 and ending for students on Friday, July 26. The program, which will be offered at no cost to identified migrant students, will be held Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. until 7 p.m. Any child will be eligible to attend if a parent has moved into the Duplin County school district within the past six years for the purpose of acquiring employment in farming, crop production, dairy, poultry or livestock work, planting trees, logging, fishing or work on fish farms and processing or hauling farm products. The curriculum of the summer program will be pre-school, kindergarten, math, arts/crafts, physical education and recreation. Transportation will be provided and breakfast, lunch and supper will be served to all attending students. In the course of meal service, no child will be discriminated against regardless of race, color, age, handicap or national origin and all children will be served the same meals.
