NCSU Dean's List

Chancellor Bruce R. Poulton has announced that 2,352 undergraduate students earned Dean's List honors during the spring semester just completed at North Carolina State University.

Students from 96 N.C. counties, 29 states outside North Carolina, and 19 foreign countries were among those who achieved the honor.

To make the Dean's List, students must earn an academic average of 3.25 or higher if they are carrying 15 or more hours of coursework, or a 3.5 or better if they are carrying 12-14 hours.

Poulton noted also that 457 undergraduates achieved a perfect 4.0 or "A" average for the semester. Of these, 405 were from North Carolina.

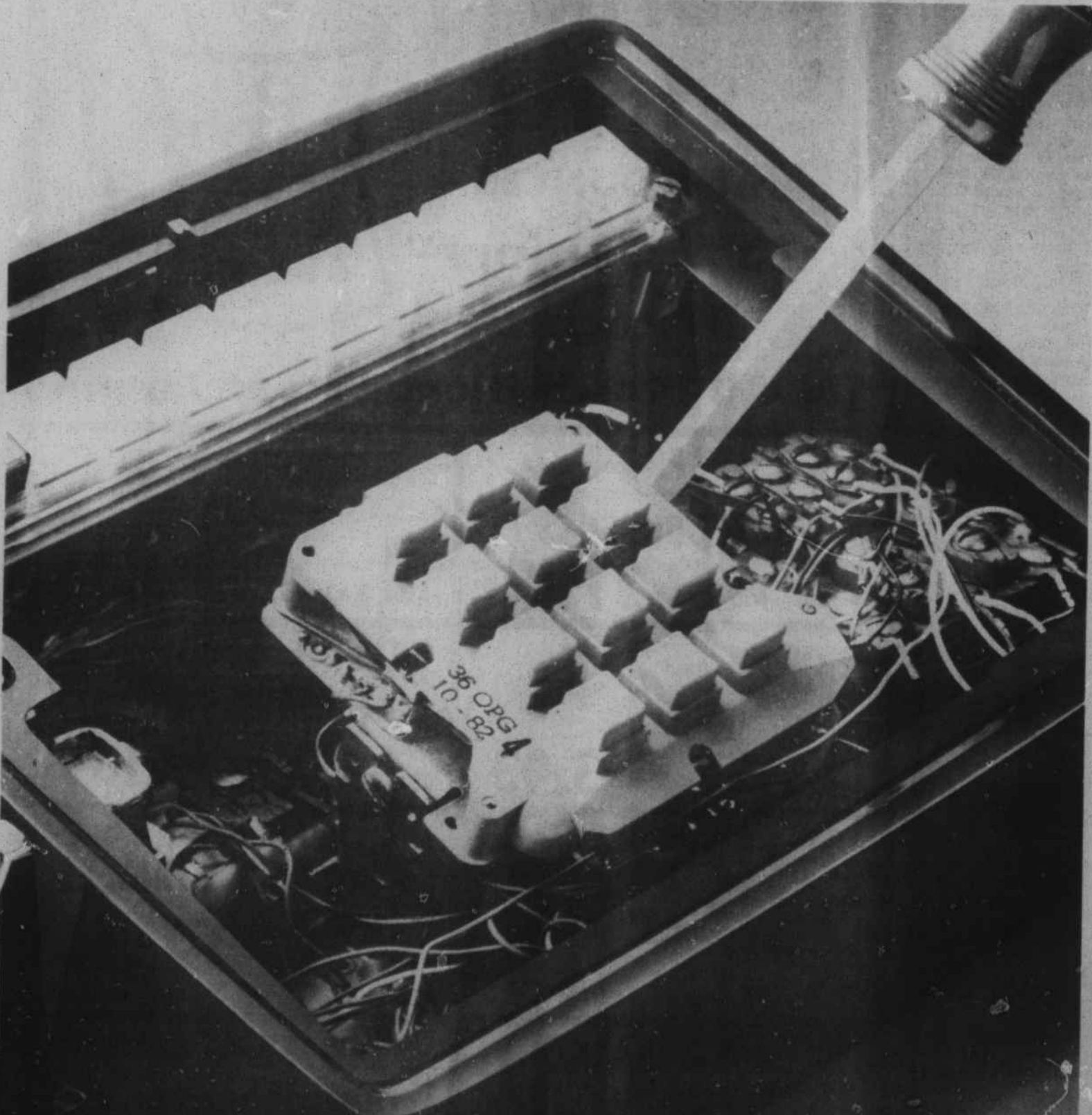

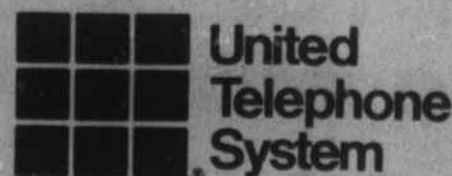
