Masonry Helper Program At JSTC

James Sprunt Technical College is accepting applications for a new masonry helper - brick tender training program offered under the auspices of the Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) through the JSTC building trades programs. The six-month training program will run from January through June and will provide training in site preparation, mortar mixing, brick sawing, masonry cleaning, proper use of tools and other skills to qualify participants as helpers. The program will also provide services of job location and placement and the development of employment skills.
