

Oriental Peculiarities. Chinese medicine developed a special fondness for fossilized "dragon

Irish Language,

The Gaelic language is the original and historical language of the people of Ireland, though most of that country's inhabitants speak English. Gaelic is now taught in the national schools, Catholic parish schools and colleges in Ireland, as well as at Harvard university, Notre Dame university and the Catholic University of America at Washington. There has been a revival of the use of Gaelic through the efforts of the Society for the Preservation of the Gaelic Language.

Beeswax Finish.

Heart Trouble Not Fatal. Heart disease is not the barrier to

an active life of usefulness as has always been supposed, said Dr. Frederick Brush to the National Society for the Promotion of Occupational Therapy. Nothing is gained and much lost by telling cardiac patients not to work, not to carry, not to play, and so on. Under proper supervision the person with heart trouble can take a large part in active life.
