### Ordinance Authorizing \$60,000 Street Bonds, Subject to Election March 7, 1922.

Be it ordained by the Board of Town Commissioners of Tryon, North Carolina:

Section 1 That there shall be issued the negotiable coupon bonds of the Town of Tryon in the aggregate principal amount of \$60,000 bearing interest at a maximum rate of six per centum per annum, for the purpose of improving and paying the streets of said Town.

Section 2 That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds as same fall due, shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 3 That a statement of the Debt of the Town has been filed with the Clerk, and is open to public inspection.

Section 4 That this Ordinance shall take effect when approved by the voters of the Municipality at an election as provided by law, which is hereby ordered to be held March 7, 1922, between the hours of 7 o'clock A. M. and 6 o'clock P. M. at the polling place which is hereby designated as at the Town Hall in said Town.

Section 5 R. T. McFee and A. L. Hill are hereby appointed judges of the said election, and Harold Doubleday is hereby appointed Registrar.

Section 6 A new registration is hereby ordered for the said election and the Registrar will keep open the books for this purpose between the hours of nine o'clock A. M. and five o'clock P. M. beginning on February 18, and closing February 25. On Saturday February 18 the Registrar will keep the books open at the polling place. On Saturday February 25 the Registrar will attend at the polling place with the said books for inspection and objection to any names registered therein as provided in municipal elections.

Section 7 At said election those favoring the issuance of the said bonds and the levy of the taxes therefor, shall vote a ballot on which shall be written or printed the words "For Bonds" and those opposing the issuance of said bonds shall vote a ballot on which shall be written or printed the words "Against Bonds."

The foregoing Ordinance was passed on the sixteenth day of January 1922 and was first published on the nineteenth day of January 1922. Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said Ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication.
