Be it ordained by the Board of Town Commissioners of Tryon, North Caro-

Section 1 That there shall be issued the negotiable coupon bonds of the Town of Tryon in the aggregate principal amount of \$60,000 bearing interest at a maximum rate of six per centum per annum, for the purpose of improving and paving the streets of said Town.
