

**New Town Manager** 

At a special meeting of the Mayor and Town Commissioners, held Monday evening at 5 o'clock, W. W. Harris, Jr., of Spartanburg was appointed as Town Manager.

The Commission felt that at no time in the history of this community has there been more urgent need of a man to fill this position. With work already started on the water savings problem and a large amount of other work essential to the improvement of Tryon, the Board sought a Town Manager immediateely after taking office. Mr. Harris, was among several applicants for the position, and after some little consideration the Board accepted his qualifications and notified him to report for duty at once.

Mr. Harris is expected to assume his office this week. He is a graduate of West Point Army Academy, and served with the United States Infantry since his graduation about capacities during his Army service been sent on foreign detail. He resigned from the Army with the rank of Major last December.

Mr. Harris expects to bring his wife and two children to Tryon as soon as they have
