### To Polk County Cotton Growers

A new disease of cotton (cotton blight) has appeared in many counties of the state.Mr. Fredrick A. Wolfe, State Plant Patholigist describes leaves or branches, dark brown sunken spots may be found at the base of the affected leaves and spots appear as brown streaks McIntosh are spending a few looved the main steams. The days in Denver N. C. with with leaves are so weakened that off, as well as the stems or branches. In severe cases, the plant may become destitute of leaves and consequently die.

This disease has never been epidemic in N. C. It appeared in epidemic form in Arkansas in 1920, which was a very wet season there. Cloudy wet weather appears to be the cause of infection. Sunshine at four o'clock. Mrs. J. W. effectually stops this trouble. Jack will have charge of the large growth trouble.


