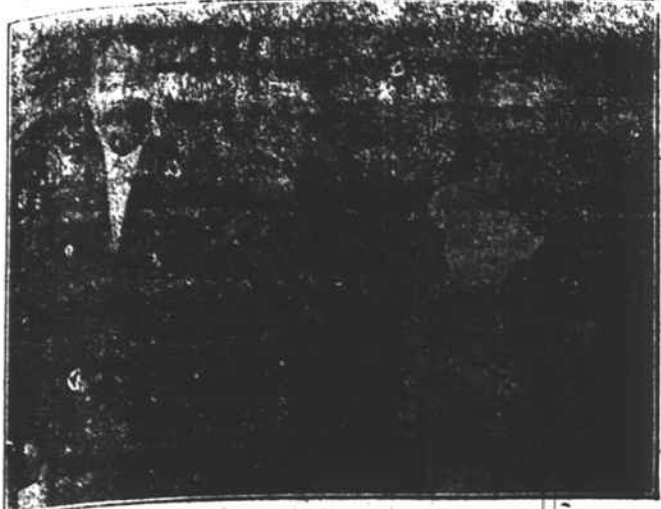


EDMOND'S HOLD FAMILY RE-UNION

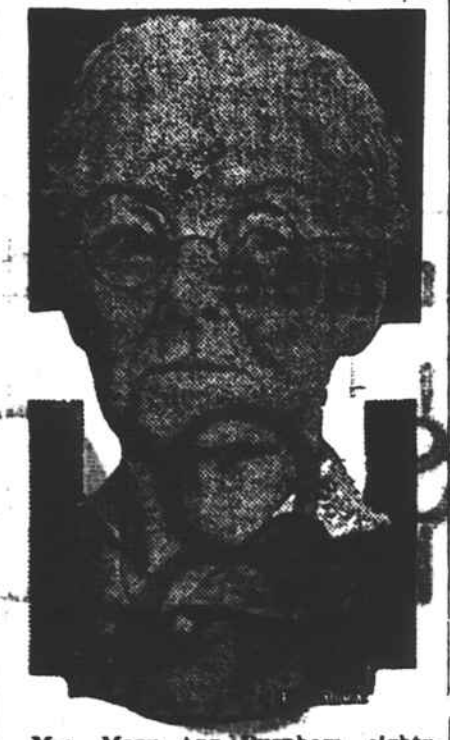
