The crowd formed around Dr. Chappell and expressed profound joy at his exoneration. Dr. Chappell was overjoyed and with a broad smile upon his face said, "I never was so happy in my life." The wife of the accused minister was also present, but found difficulty in expressing her feelings of the verdict. but said, "I am so happy I don't know what to do". The large dele-
