Th. following is a copy of the Mayors letter to the Tryon Chamber of Commerce:

Tryon, N. C. Aug. 9th. 26. Chamber of Commerce, Tryon, N. C. Gentlemen:

I respectfully ask that your organization appoint a committee of representative citizens, who will cooperate with me, and the Town's Commissioners for the purpose of ascertaining the rates it will be necessary to charge water consumers to meet the fixed charges on water works bonds and the operating expenses.
