Points of Difference

The union men wanted bus drivers and barn men included in the contract to be adopted but the company's proposal provided only for conductors and motormen.

The men asked a ten-cent an hour increase for all employes and five cents additional for one-man operation. The latter was being paid but the company refused to include it in the contract.

A six-day week was asked. This was generally in effect but was not provided in the contract.

The men asked fifteen minites for meals with pay. This also, was verbally granted but was not in the contract.

When William G. Plemmons was asked for a statement regarding the strike settlement he said that all differences had been peacefully and satisfact-ory settled. "All of the men are going back to work and there is no hard feeling between them and the company." Mr. Walters, he said, would give out a statement showing details of the settlement.
