



The President submitted to Congress on March 3rd his demand for new taxes to take the place of the processing taxes and to provide funds to pay the bonus. As the House Ways and Means Committee proceeded with its hearings, the protest of business became stronger, although the House finally passed the bill by a large vote. Taking up the measure, the Senate Finance Committee conducted its hearings, with many of the same witnesses appearing before it.
