



Earth's Temperature May Be 8,000 Degrees 100 Miles Down

Wells, water, gas or oil, show what the interior of the earth is like. Deep wells in California reveal that the temperature of the earth rises about one degree for every 25 feet of lepth. In Wyoming the temperature nounts one degree for each 22 feet. At 3,500 feet there, water boils. Other parts of the earth are not so hot, however. The average rise in temperature is only about 80 degrees per mile, or about one degree for each 66 feet of depth. At this rate, the temperature of the earth 100 miles down may be 8,000 degrees, only a thousand degrees cooler than




