our best young people, and not less our young scientists and learned men in all fields."

"Like the Protestant church in America, the Philippine church is a bit stunned by the magnitude of the opportunity it faces and the challenge that these days present," says the Rev. Ernest E. Tuck, D.L., of Seattle, Wash., superintendent of

the Methodist church in the Philippine Islands, recently returned from a survey of the churches there. "Spiritually the Philippine church has passed through a very trying ordeal for three or four years," he adds. "But the resiliency, the latent spiritual resources, and our particular form of church organization have produced a hopefulness, a resolve, and expectancy, and a unity that altogether spell victory in the hard years ahead. The Philippine church earnestly seeks all the cooperation and spiritual help the older church in America can give."

Officials and constituent churches of the National Christian Council of India are considering proposals for a vast educational and evangelistic program for the villages of that land by way of the radio. The plan is ambitious: it calls for the establishment of a religious department in the present All-India Radio (governmental); the establishment of about 130 new transmitting stations in key centers of the country; and the placing of at least one receiving set in each of India's 700,000 villages. All-India Radio already has plans for such a wide use of the radio, and the N.C.C. hopes to help make it an educational rather than an entertainment service. There is being envisioned programs of Indian Christian music, Indian Christian drama,

lectures from the universities, women's and rural and health improvement programs, etc. "One can see thousands of people in thousands of villages gathered around the radio in the quiet of an evening when the day's work is done—much as they gather in some villages for classes and services today," says one official.

The Board of Missions and Church Extension of the Methodist Church (150 Fifth Ave., New York 11, N. Y.), which for more than a century has been sending young people for life-time services as missionaries to Asia, Africa, South America, and Europe, is now asking, in addition, for several hundreds of young men and women for three-year service overseas. They will be missionaries of the Church, working alongside the life service missionaries, and it is hoped that many of them will remain for longer than the three-year period of "enlistment." The fields open for three-year service include teaching, group leadership, preaching, social work, religious education, building construction, farming, business management, nursing, medical, and public health skills. Countries of service include the Belgian Congo, India, China, Liberia, Malaya, the Philippines and Southern Rhodesia; others may be included later. Applicants must be single men or women, between 21 and 25 years of age, college graduates, members of the Methodist church, and have had some experience in the service sought. The Board will give them specialized training before sent overseas.


