Sealed bids will be received until 11 o'clock a. m., October 22, 1946, by the undersigned at its office in the City of Raleigh, N. C., for a \$8,000 Water Bond Anticipation Note of the Town of Wallace, North Carolina, dated October 15, 1946, maturing April 15, 1947 (without option of prior payment), and bearing interest at not more than 6 per cent per

annum, payable at the maturity of the note.

The note is being issued to anticipate the receipt of the proceeds of a like amount of Water Bonds.

Delivery of note on or about October 29, 1946, at place of purchaser's choice.  
Bidders should specify the interest rate (not exceeding 6 per cent per annum), and the City and the bank therein at which principal and interest shall be payable. There will be no auction.
