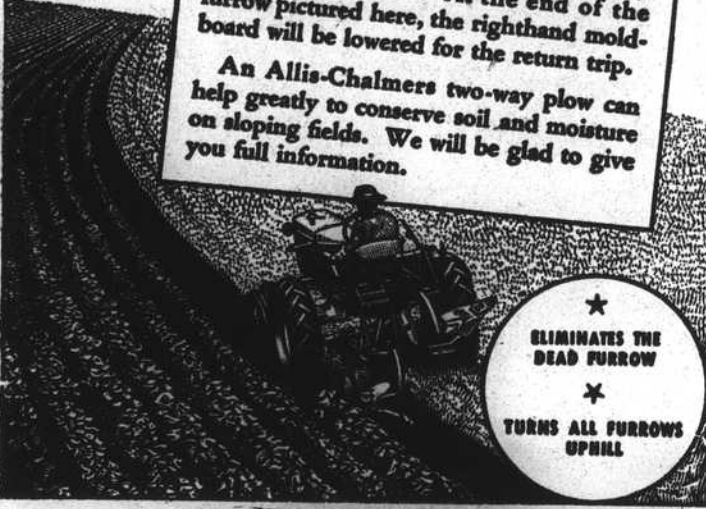

## TWO-WAY TRACTOR PLOW

This field is being plowed on the contour, across the slope, with all furrows turned in the same direction—uphill. Rain water caught by the lapped furrows is held on the slope to benefit crops. Uncontrolled, that same water might easily form ruinous gullies or leach soil fertility by sheet erosion.

The Allis-Chalmers tractor-mounted two-way pick-up plow is hydraulically raised and lowered. At the end of the furrow pictured here, the righthand mold-board will be lowered for the return trip.

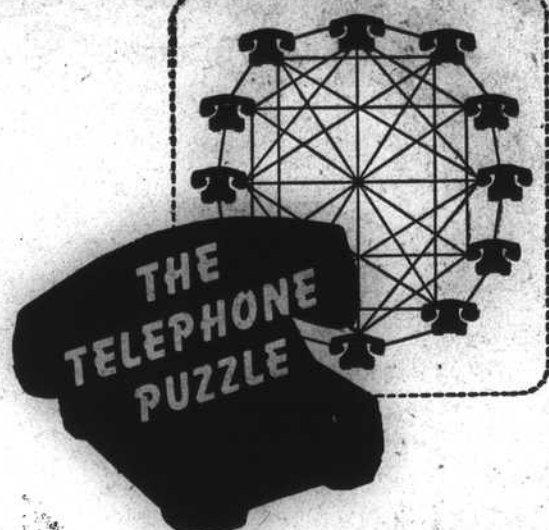
