CAPITOL. . . . The Capitol is built of light - gray sandstone and matching marble. The building is 751 feet 4 inches long, 350 feet wide, and measures 287 feet 5 1-2 inches in height from the base line on the east front to the top of the Statue of Freedom. One of the in-CAPITOL. . . . The Capitol is on the east front to the top of the Statue of Freedom. One of the in-teresting features of the Capitol is the unbroken corridor on the first floor which extends 750 feet. There are other corridors longer in Washington — the Department of Agri-culture has one that is 88 feet, Commerce, 991 feet, and the Pen-tagon, 906 feet. The Capitol covers 3 1-2 acres of ground, contains a floor area of 14 acres, and has 435 rooms. The Capitol and the three buildings previously mentioned which comprise "The Hill" are located in a park of 131 acres.

The Senate Office Building is Northeast of the Capitol.
