ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING \$7,300 OF BONDS OF THE TOWN OF BEAUFORT FOR FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT. BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Beaufort, North Carolina: Section 1. That pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act, 1921, bonds of the Town of Beaufort, of the maximum aggregate amount of \$7,300 are hereby authorized to be issued for the necessary expense and purpose of making repairs to fire fighting equipment of the Town and for acquisition of fire fighting apparatus for the Town.

Sec. 2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds herein authorized shall be annually levied and collected. Sec. 3. That a statement of the debt of the Town has been filed with the Clerk and is open to public inspection. Sec. 4. That this ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under the Municipal Finance Act, in such event it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the Town at an election as provided in said Act.
