Three Professors Arrive At Duke Laboratory: Recent arrivals at the Duke University Marine Laboratory include Dr. and Mrs. C. S. Appar, of Elizabethtown College, Elizabethtown, Pa., Dr. T. P. Haas of the Philadelphia College of Science and Pharmacy, and Dr. and Mrs. Reinard Harkema, of North Carolina State college.

Dr. Harkema is continuing the program of research he began at the laboratory last year on the parasites of North Carolina fishes. He is secretary of the North Carolina Academy of Science.

Dr. Haas is on a brief collecting trip in order to obtain botanical materials for the museum of Philadelphia college. He is particularly interested in obtaining insectivorous plants. He has collected and photographed in color about eight species, including the Venus fly trap.
