While there Mrs. Westline became the wife of a chief yeoman from Washington, D. C. They were married by the American ambassador. The evacuation from Nanking was by air. Navy wives and families were flown to the port of Tsingtao where part of the American fleet was at anchor. Army wives were flown to Shanghai. The transport on which Mrs. Poulk returned had a 500 capacity but 900 were jammed aboard. Even the captain had to give up his usual quarters. On the return, the ship stopped at one Japanese port and then continued to the United States where it docked Dec. 31. Mrs. Poulk and Spook were home for Christmas. Spockie remembered his grandfather whom he calls "Pop." He wanted Pop immediately to take him out back to see the chickens. The youngster was a good traveler. Aside from a few minor upsets on the way over, he stayed healthy while his mother spent several days in bed seasick. "That month crossing the Pacific was the longest I ever spent in my life," she said. She was thankful her husband was at the dock to meet them.
